### Award for Innovation and Excellence in Engineering goes to Isky



Beech Underwriting Agencies and the BDRHoF wanted to mark Ed Iskenderian's visit to the UK by sponsoring a special Hall of Fame trophy and the Earl of Onslow was keen to present it. On the Trophy it says for Innovation and Excellence in Engineering.

Ed decided to enter the camshaft grinding business in the late 1940s after having to wait five months for

cubic inch, greater than any other racing cam maker. He pioneered drag racing corporate sponsorship in the 1950s by backing Don Garlits and produced the first co-ordinated cam and assembly kit for hot rodders.

In 1963, in collaboration with a few other industry pioneers, Ed created what is now the Specialty Equipment Market Association, originally the Speed Equipment Manufacturers' Association. One of the first official events which SEMA backed was the International Dragster Challenge organised by Sydney Allard in the UK during the same year.



Ed built his company into the world's largest racing, performance and economy cam manufacturer. In 1985 he was inducted as a member of Chevrolet's Legends of Performance and SEMA's Hall of Fame. Ed has certainly earned the title of the Cam Father.

BDRHoF Honorary Chairman Stu Bradbury said, "There can be nobody more deserving to receive this award. He not only developed horse power by his expertise; he has been involved in creating a sport – plus a complete speed industry to feed it. Ed is very much part of drag racing's DNA; admired all over the world. I thank him for making the journey."

### **Allard Awards presented**



The Sydney Allard Media Awards pay tribute to the influence of journalists and photographers in the promotion of drag racing, along with the role played by Sydney Allard in establishing the sport in Europe during the early 1960s. This year the awards are sponsored by Mintex, manufacturers of brake pads since 1908 and of the one sponsors of the 1964 International Drag Racing

Festivals organised by Sydney Allard.

The outright winner of the 2016 Sydney Allard Photo Journalism Award was Julian Hunt for a fire burnout photograph of Bob Hawkins in Time Traveller, his blown and injected Chevrolet methanol-burning dragster. It was taken during the 2016 Dragstalgia Meeting at Santa Pod Raceway.

The independent judges were David Lillywhite, Editorial Director of Octane magazine along with the magazine's designer Robert Hefferon. They initially selected the Top Ten. Pink Floyd drummer, Trustee of the National Motor Museum, Beaulieu, and Co-Patron of the Allard Chrysler Action Group Nick Mason chose the top three and placed them in order.

Second place went to Stuart Mitchell for his photo of Tony Betts' 1934 Ford Coupe which sports a blown and injected 526 cubic inch Keith Black engine. Again this photo was taken at the 2016 Dragstalgia Meeting. Third place went to John Kennedy for his photo of Mark Moseley's Nissan R32 Skyline which has an RB30 engine. It was taken at the 2015 Flame and Thunder Show held at Santa Pod Raceway.

Choosing a winner for the 2016 Sydney Allard Written Journalism Award was very difficult but Brian Taylor is the judges' final choice for his work in compiling the twenty four-page 2015 British Drag Racing Hall of Fame Gala Awards Dinner

Souvenir Programme. The Chief Judge was Guy Loveridge, Deputy Chairman of the Guild of Motoring Writers, who said "It sounds an easy task to write and edit an event programme, but a good programme is crammed with information, profiles, facts and the full course of the evening. The process of collating this information is hindered by ever-changing facts coming through as the copy date

gets closer. All copy has to be approved by the show organisers and those featured in the programme – some based overseas. Then there are the advertisers to consider and liaison with the programme designers and printers. To edit anything is a tricky business, but to edit seamlessly, so that one reads and is not distracted by the editor's own spin is a rare gift indeed – and for that reason Brian must be recognised for his programme production.

"A very special mention for Martin Drake whose astonishing on-line photo book Power of Sport - Drag Racing read as an impassioned essay on our sport. If a



picture paints a thousand words Martin has aced Shakespeare for word-count! And highly commended for a range of pieces entered, all of which entertained and informed, is Keith Lee. His work demonstrates knowledge and skills that convey the message clearly and the excitement of drag racing with passion."

### **Junior Champions Honoured**



At the Gala Dinner, US Automotive, the Santa Pod Racers Club, Lucas Oil Products UK Limited and Atlantic Fluid Tech again jointly sponsored two corporate tables for the Top Three Junior Dragster drivers and the Top Three Junior Bike riders.

Earlier in the evening they each received a selection of personally signed Hero Cards organised by Don Schumacher Racing and the signatures include people like Antron Brown, Tony Schumacher, Ron Capps, Jack

Beckman and Matt Hagan. Even Tommy Ivo got in on the act. The riders and drivers came up to the stage so that the guests could show how much they value these future stars' involvement in our sport.

The IOPD was formed in 1990 to regulate and support the driving-experience sector of recreational motorsport in the UK. It was brought about by the MSA / RAC's refusal to recognise and permit Run What You Brung events and track driving activities, thereby denying participants and organisers a route to legitimisation and parity with mainstream motor sports. As well as drag and sprint events, the IOPD now takes on authorising permits for a range of disciplines of recreational auto activity across one-, two- three-, four- six- and eight-wheeled activities including tracked and jet thrust vehicles – in fact any discipline



from Mini Moto to F1. Through its statutory powers, the IOPD also authorises and permits many of the world's international motor manufacturers' driving-experience programs and track days. Steve Murty of the IOPD said "We are more than happy to support the British Drag Racing Hall of Fame as a totally non-political, impartial organisation dedicated to recognising and celebrating the special people that have given so much to create our sport today. The annual Gala Awards Dinner is a fabulous event and we had a fantastic evening. Next year we celebrate forty years of drag racing at York Raceway so maybe we will start the party early."

The BDRHoF has been working with a division of **The Big Film Group** for some time regarding the BDRHoF logo appearing on popular TV programmes. That division is Prop Portfolio Limited and they have achieved considerable success on our behalf with multiple appearances on Hollyoaks and more to come. Thus far, the logo appearances have reached a media



value of just over £5K, secured 45 seconds of airtime for the brand and reached an audience of 2.5 million people. Latest storylines have featured the sticker as an integral part of the show with it being in the pathway of a bullet used for attempted murder – one of the biggest storylines this year. Keep your eyes peeled for more placements on popular TV soaps.



Tom Hoover began his drag racing career in the summer of 1962 and took the Top Fuel Dragster title at the 1965 AHRA Winternationals. He switched to Funny Cars in 1968 and it this class in which he really found fame. Tom's cars were known for their fabulous looks as well as performance. He won five NHRA National Events and was 1976 AHRA Funny Car Champion. But in the UK we know him because we adopted him as a Brit when he


raced extensively at Santa Pod during the 1980s. Many of his cars had a second life in this country with different drivers. He always has time for the fans which is why he is considered one of the most popular Funny Car racers of all time.

Cleveland based **Gentleman Joe Schubeck** is the drag racer who started Lakewood Products back in the 1960s – Lakewood being a suburb of Cleveland. He had to retire from racing for a while as the business grew but George Hurst eventually persuaded him back in a car by promising that Linda Vaughn would be on his pit crew. Joe is a former SEMA Board Member, a pioneer on the SEMA Safety Committee, and has been inducted into the SEMA Hall



of Fame for his dedication to creating products that make racing a safer sport. Lakewood Industries is now a trademark of the huge Prestolite Performance business but Joe is still inventing parts for dragsters under the name Schubeck High Performance Solutions, particularly for the Nostalgia scene. He also runs a classic blown and injected 392 Chrysler Hemi nitro-burning slingshot which delights the fans at Nostalgia events.

**GiGi Carleton** was Robert E. Petersen's personal administrative assistant at Petersen Publishing Company for over forty years. Before its sale in 1996, Petersen Publishing had thirty six monthly magazines in its stable including Hot Rod, Motor Trend, Rod & Custom, Sports Car Graphic and Circle Track. Robert's



wife Margie Petersen and GiGi also formed Petersen Interiors & Designs and did all the design and purchasing for the company's sales offices throughout the USA along with company-owned suites at many sporting venues in the U.S. GiGi continues to work for the estate of Mr & Mrs Petersen and is President of the Margie & Robert E. Petersen Foundation whose mission is to fund cancer medical research, children's charities and support the world famous Petersen Automotive Museum in Los Angeles. Mr & Mrs Petersen were the founding benefactors.

British Drag Racing Hall of Fame CEO Brian Taylor said "It is fabulous that so many drag racing legends want to join us to celebrate our UK drag racing

### Gibbs, McCulloch Ace BDRHoF Gala

We were excited to hear that Steve Gibbs would be able to fly in for the Gala Awards Dinner where he accepted the Lucas Oil Global Achievement Award on behalf of NHRA. Accompanying Steve was legendary racer and tuner Ed 'The Ace' McCulloch.

**Steve Gibbs** got his first drag racing job at San Gabriel drag strip in 1961.



By 1969 he had become Advertising Director for the NHRA publication National Dragster, was made Competitions Director in 1972 and then NHRA Vice President Competitions in 1980, conducting some four hundred NHRA National Events over a twenty seven-year span. He went on to initiate the NHRA Museum

of which he is still a Board Member along with being a Selection Committee member of the International Drag Racing Hall of Fame. In fact he has been inducted into a whole bunch of Halls of Fame and received many Lifetime Achievement Awards.

Steve has been instrumental in creating and organizing both the California Hot Rod Reunion at Bakersfield, now celebrating its twenty fifth anniversary, and the 14th Annual Holley NHRA National Hot Rod Reunion, Bowling Green. He continues to play an instrumental role in the planning and execution of both Reunion events.

Steve said "It has been a long time since we visited Santa Pod in 1980 so my wife and I are both very excited over the opportunity to visit you folks once again. We had heard nothing but good things about the event and it didn't disappoint. Also joining the entourage is my daughter Cindy Gibbs Arias, a renowned motorsports artist in her own right."



Ed 'The Ace' McCulloch began driving Top Fuel Dragsters in 1964 and Funny Cars in 1969. He won the first time he ever raced at the US Nationals in 1971 and before the end of the season had acquired backing from model kit manufacturer Revell. During the next six years with the company, he made the cars name RRRRevellution famous. He has taken six wins at the NHRA US Nationals at Indianapolis. Following

his retirement as a driver at the end of the 1993 season Ed carried out tuning duties for Connie Kalitta, Don Prudhomme and Don Schumacher.

For his successful drag racing career he has been inducted into the International Drag Racing Hall of Fame and the Motorsports Hall of Fame of America. To quote Jon Asher in his Motorsports Hall of Fame citation "In motorsport there are drivers, tuner / mechanics and builders. It's rare that an individual occupies more than one slot. Ed McCulloch is one of those exceptions."

Ed said "This is my first visit to the UK and a long overdue one because I have heard so much about Santa Pod Raceway and the British Drag Racing Hall of Fame but never had the time to get over there. It was great to meet the fans and racers in Europe."

### **New Global Impact Award goes to Beach Boys**

**The Beach Boys** were recipients of a special Global Impact Award being presented at the BDRHoF Gala Awards Dinner being held at the Sheraton Skyline Hotel, London Heathrow on November 19th. One of the original Beach Boys, David Lee Marks, was there to accept the award on behalf of the band who have been behind the music which inspired more than a generation of hot rodders and drag racing enthusiasts, and who via their concerts have continued to raise awareness of these unique sports throughout the world for over fifty years.



Often called "America's Band", The Beach Boys are the number one-selling US band of all time. The band was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame Class of 1988. Specifically the award is being made for the 1963 Album Little Deuce Coupe although they have featured drag racing and hot rodding songs on many of their albums that have sold in excess of one hundred million copies. Little Deuce Coupe includes numbers such as Car Crazy Cutie, 409, Cherry, Cherry Coupe, Our Car Club and Shutdown.

David Lee Marks was Dennis Wilson's best friend, and lived across the street from the Wilson Brothers Brian, Dennis and Carl. He jammed with them, and was part of the band for the first four studio albums Surfin Safari,

Surfin USA, Surfer Girl and Little Deuce Coupe. He left the band for a while and formed his own group The Marksmen, and also played with artists such as Delaney and Bonnie. He re-joined The Beach Boys in 1997 and was part of the band for their 50th Anniversary World Tour in 2012. At that time Mike Love said "David rocks. A phenomenal guitarist. When he does those leads on Surfin, Surfin Surfari and Fun, Fun, Fun it's so authentic. He's a fantastic musician". David has since worked on The Beach Boys' 50th Anniversary Album That's Why God Made the Radio and Brian Wilson's album No Pier Pressure.

David said "I am delighted to join those celebrating British drag racing pioneers and The Beach Boys contribution to the British motoring world. It is an honour to accept the award on behalf of the band which is still on tour. I'm thrilled also to be meeting fans of the sport and of The Beach Boys."

British Drag Racing Hall of Fame Honorary Chairman Stu Bradbury said "It is an extraordinary opportunity to have a member of The Beach Boys with us at our Gala Evening and I



thank the National Street Rod Association for sponsoring this award and BDRHoF Management Board Director Guy Loveridge for organising this along with our Sponsorship Partner Beech Underwriting Agencies. This was the music of my youth and it is great that they still include those 1960s songs in their itinerary today. I can't tell you how much of a thrill it is to host this award presentation."

The National Street Rod Association commented, "We're so pleased we could take part in this fabulous occasion again and celebrate the music that has been a part of drag racing and hot rodding for so many years. The Beach Boys have, and always will be, the band that plays our music and it is fitting that we share this award with the British Drag Racing Hall of Fame."

Joining the presentation team was well known radio and TV presenter as well as popular music historian Mike Read. Famous for his time on Radio 1 and Top of the Pops, a little-known fact is that Mike's first voice over radio commercial in 1976 was promoting Santa Pod Raceway, so he has a long history with the sport. He recently launched his new TV series Tin Pan Alley, the first ever TV competition for songwriters which can be found on Showbiz TV (Sky 266). The show is broadcast on Sundays at 18:30 hours with a repeat on Fridays at 20:00.

### Rat Trap aims for 2017 Goodwood Festival of Speed



The Fiftieth Anniversary World Tour of the legendary AA / Fuel Altered Rat Trap in 2016 was such a success that more dates around the world have been added for 2017, with additional appearances now scheduled for New Zealand and England.

The 2016 Tour wrapped up with a prestigious display of the Rat Trap race car at the BDRHoF Gala and a special surprise award for **Ron Hope**, presented by Stu Bassett of US

Automotive. BDRHoF sponsorship partner Geoff Stilwell made a detailed and amusing tribute to Ron which we have summarised below:

Ron lives, eats, sleeps, breathes racing. Not only drag racing but also Land speed racing. He has set records at Bonneville and at El Mirage where he is a member of the 200mph club known as the "Dirty 2" club.

Ron grew up in Whittier, California. Ak Miller's Garage was the place to hang out locally and Ron could be found there most days with the likes of Jack Lufkin, Jerry Kugel of Kugel Hot Rod fame and many others. Like so many kids of that era he was hooked on motorsports and regularly attended the numerous local drag strips and the dry lakes races.

His first trip to Bonneville was in 1960 and he soon found his way into the record books setting a land speed record in 1964 with partner Jerry Tucker in a Chrysler-powered '32 Ford C/Gas Roadster at 165 mph.

In 1970, Ron joined the infamous Fuel Altered Tour crewing for Don Green on The Original Rat Trap. The tall tales of their exploits are legendary as the crews used Ron's Chicago apartment as a home-away-from-home and impromptu workshop.



To get into the '2 Club' at Bonneville you have to set a record at over 200 mph, not just go 200 mph. Ron made it in 1998 driving Ron Benham's modified sports car with a speed of 216.116 mph.

Ron is one of the most family oriented racers there are. In total there are 6 children and 18 grandchildren and to keep track of the children and grandchildren Ron gives them all a number. Oh this is number 6 or

number 13 when they are running around the pits. The funny part about it is they all know their numbers...

Stories of their family get-togethers at Thanksgiving or Christmas are epic. Such as the time they all went Karting and were so competitive the operator shut down the track and banned them. But they went back the next day when a new attendant was there and caused more chaos...

Besides Ron, brother Steve is a long time drag and land speed racer. Wife Dianne has driven at Bonneville and The Ohio Mile. Son Brian, of course, drives Pure Hell and at Bonneville. Brian's daughter Victoria has a record at over 215 mph at Bonneville and has raced the Ohio Mile and has an NHRA Competition license.

Hope has Nephew Tom raced Bonneville, circuits and at the NHRA tracks while grandsons Blake, Wyatt and Michael have all raced The Ohio Mile. Wyatt attends the Frank Hawley School in the New Year to get his license by the way. The generation of Racers is already in the planning.

Ron suffered a major heart attack in 2015. However, that did not slow him down. Just 28 days after his heart surgery Ron got on a plane to New



Zealand because of a commitment he had to attend an event. During the event

Ron committed to return to New Zealand for the Beach Hop and Nostalgia drags a month later. When he returned as the Grand Marshall of the Nostalgia Drags, even though Ron was on "restrictions from racing" he kinda snuck in the car to do a fire burnout for the fans.

At this year's Dragstalgia Ron set his fastest speed ever in Rat Trap going 231 mph in the quarter.

This year was also another milestone for Ron in that he celebrated 45 years of marriage to Dianne in July actually over the Dragstalgia weekend. So many congratulations to you both.

He is without doubt one of the best ambassadors drag racing has. He has enabled Lord March of Goodwood to get his Land speed license and of course I came under his spell this year enabling me to get my "B" class license for driving at over 183 on the salt.

And when he's not racing Ron is still going full speed running his company Capital Automotive Reconditioning Services. Based in his hometown of Franklin, Tennessee, CARS has more than 1,000 employees all over the USA. Ron started the company in 2003 at age 60 when most people are winding down.



And there's no stopping him. In January the team are heading back to New Zealand for the Leadfoot Festival - the Goodwood Festival of the Southern Hemisphere. Funnily enough, at that inaugural Leadfoot meeting Ron forgot he was at a hill climb and missed the left turn going head on into a stream. No matter, the car was quickly rebuilt and they were racing just a few weeks later. Then it's back to Bakersfield for the March Meet Then on to Bowling Green for the Reunion before heading back to England to the Goodwood Festival of Speed. So as you can see Ron has no intention of giving up.

Ron and the family have touched so many lives here in the UK, Stu and Jayne Bassett, my good friend Tony

Thacker, mine and of course Rob and Nick of HAVOC who, because of Ron's enthusiasm and 'can-do' attitude will be racing the nostalgia series next year in the US.

"I am truly touched by receiving this award", Ron said. "We had a fantastic time racing at Saskatoon, Canada, at Santa Pod in England and Hockenheim, Germany" said Ron. "Fan reaction has been so strong that we're planning on returning to England for the Goodwood Festival of Speed in 2017. And, of course, we've booked a full schedule of races in the US and dates in New Zealand too. Racing in front of the fans is what drives us to continue, and we're grateful to all our sponsors for helping make this tour possible."

During 2017 the Havoc Fuel Altered team of driver **Nick Davies** and BDRHoF inductee **Rob Loaring** will be undertaking a tour of the US, sponsored by Ron Hope, Beech Underwriting, Lawrie Gatehouse and US Automotive. The team will be based out of Ron's shop in Franklin, Tennessee, and will be racing at the March Meet and 26th California Hot Rod Reunion at Famoso Raceway near Bakersfield, and at the 15th Holley NHRA National Hot Rod Reunion, Bowling Green, Kentucky.



Havoc ran with a nitro fuelled Donovan engine for the first time in 2016 and the results were spectacular to say the least. After a few dropped cylinders at Dragstalgia, the team returned at the FIA Euro Finals and ran their best to date, a 6.28/229mph.



During August, BDRHoF Sponsorship Partner and International Liaison adviser **Geoff Stilwell** visited Bonneville Salt Flats where he gained his B class licence following a run of 180.173 mph in Ron Hope's 7551 Gas Modified Roadster. At the start of October, Geoff topped up his air miles once again and returned to the US to run 7551 at the Ohio Mile at Wilmington. The car's sump had needed welding and different rear gears were installed. Geoff's best run was 183.4489 mph before rain halted proceedings.

At the FIA Euro Finals, Santa Pod put on a 'Meet and Greet session with BDRHoF members **Dennis Priddle** and **Barry Sheavills**. Others attending included Fourtime FIA Top Fuel Champion Andy Carter, former FIA Top Fuel Champion Smax Smith who now races in the US, Sue Coles, Sylvia Read-Hauser, Gordon Appleton, Peter Bennett, and Brian Hazleton.



Dennis was present with his International Drag Racing Hall of Fame trophy which he received in Gainesville in March and was re-presented to him at the Gala dinner by Harry Hibler and Ed 'The Ace' McCulloch.



Whilst at the Euro Finals, Ian Turburville, who owns two nostalgia slingshot dragsters, met up with IDRHoF inductee and BDRHoF member **Dennis Priddle**. Ian has recently acquired the very Donovan 417 engine with which Dennis ran the world record slingshot dragster ET of 6.04 in 1975, and Dennis was able to verify it with its serial number of 144. He will be supplying Ian with technical advice and parts.

Ian will be putting the engine in his *True Blood* slingshot and running it in 2017 on nitro as a cackle car, with a special cackle tune to ensure maximum flames and noise, and also set up to be capable of burnouts and smoky launches with a chute pop at half track.

Allard Chrysler Action Group Chair and BDRHoF CEO **Brian Taylor** says that the Group's mission has been accomplished:

"We have achieved what I set out to do back in 2007 - to restore the dragster so that it can parade under its own power.

"There will be general maintenance to do of course and we have someone who has volunteered to redo the seat upholstery. The tacho needs to be fixed and we need to ensure that Beaulieu staff members are familiar with operating procedures. I also need to complete the full story for the Beaulieu library so



everyone can access the story of the dragster and its restoration. At the moment that is about 390 pages.

"I will keep everyone informed about future appearances and ACAG team members local to the museum will continue to help out as necessary. Thanks to everyone who has helped. You have been a part of a very special story."



### **About the British Drag Racing Hall of Fame**

The British Drag Racing Hall of Fame is a not for profit organisation that was established in 2006 to recognise significant contributions or achievements in the sport of British drag racing. It is run by volunteers and the twelve Selection Board members include club & track officials, promoters, former racers, journalists and fans with a long background in the sport. They convene annually to nominate candidates for inclusion into the Hall of Fame.

Eligibility for induction into the British Drag Racing Hall Of Fame is extended to any person who has driven, piloted, owned, designed, built, maintained, prepared, promoted, officiated, supported or taken part in any capacity connected with British drag racing. An inductee must have been retired for a least three years or must have been engaged at the top level of his/her area of British drag racing for at least 20 years, or made a recognizable and significant contribution to the sport. Inductees are characterized by their desire to win, mastery of their own particular field and courage to innovate.
